St. John's Mission Endowment Fund

"Let a man so account of us, as the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God. Moreover, it is required in stewards, that a person be found faithful". I Corinthians 4:1-2

These powerful words are found in a brochure put together over twenty years ago when our Mission Endowment Fund was first established. Pastor Emeritus, Ned Elsass, provided an explanation of what these words mean; "God is the giver of all good gifts of which we partake; our church and families, food, shelter, clothing and our talents and treasures. In addition to all of this, we have been blessed with countless opportunities to experience the grandeurs of God's creation. All provided by God's grace".

Over twenty years ago, one of the members of St John's, in gratitude to God, established the St. John's Mission Endowment Fund. The concept was that the monies contributed would serve as the principal of the fund and would never be spent. Interest generated by the fund would be reinvested to help grow the fund and a portion would be gifted to local missions. These funds are not used for the operation of Saint John's Lutheran Church. Since its establishment, others have made contribution to the fund. In time, the fund has grown to over \$224,000. Over time, the fund has provided nearly \$130,000 to local charitable organizations. Most of these charities are located right here in Southwest Michigan. Some of the recipients have been Centered on Wellness, Safe Shelter, Benton Harbor Soup Kitchen, Forgotten Man Ministries, Catholic Community Food Pantry, Hospice at Home and countless others. This year, funds are being directed to the following charitable organizations.

<u>Girls on the Run</u>-Program for young girls that promotes empowerment by teaching life skills through lessons and running. (This group is headquartered at our church). \$2,000

<u>InterFaith Action</u>-A coalition of various faith communities seeking to advance justice especially for those on the margins of community life. \$4000

<u>Centered on Wellness</u>- Professional Faith based individual, couples and group counseling for mental wellness and addiction recovery. \$4000

<u>Forgotten Man Ministries</u>-Biblically based, chaplain led, volunteer ministry to Michigan jails providing teaching and preaching the love of Jesus Christ to inmates and those recently released. \$1000

<u>The Avenue/Safe Shelter</u>-Emergency shelter providing housing, food and clothing for women and children that suffer domestic abuse. \$1000

<u>Neighbor to Neighbor</u> - Offers client-centered programs, emergency assistance, and community services to Berrien, Cass, and Van Buren counties. \$1000

<u>Salvation Army</u> – An organization dedicated to doing the most good in the community. They help clients overcome poverty, combat addiction, help disaster survivors, and feed the hungry. \$1000

<u>Neighbor by Neighbor</u> – Neighbor by Neighbor connects the most vulnerable residents of SW Berrien County with resources and services to address immediate needs, while facilitating greater independence through targeted programs and services. \$1000

Goals include new roof, outdoor sign update, curb accesibilty, and parking lot improvements. Our goal is to raise \$70,000. \$65,651.10 has been donated. **\$4,348.90 remains to reach our goal.**



Michigan's Governor, Gretchen Whitmer, in her State of the State address on January 26th outlined her priorities for the coming year. Interfaith Action, in accord with its policy commitments, is supportive of the following initiatives:

- raising the Earned Income Tax Credit from 6% to 20% of the federal credit. Earned Income Tax
 Credits provide a major boost in lifting individuals and families out of poverty. It is estimated that
 this increase would send 730,000 low-income families an average of \$3,000 (\$2,500 from the
 federal tax credit and \$450 from the increased state tax credit.)
- providing a \$2,500 state tax rebate (in addition to the federal rebate) for the purchase of an electric vehicle, designed to reduce environmental pollution through the use of clean energy.
 - invest in improving access to mental health services, with an emphasis on students.

Interfaith Action Policy Briefing

Over the course of 2022, Interfaith Action will hold bi-monthly policy briefings to share our current policy initiatives, areas of concern, and other developments. The format for these briefings will include covering three or four major topics over the course of one hour, including why each topic is important to Interfaith Action, our involvement with the issue, current status and future actions, followed by a few minutes for questions and discussion.

Our first policy briefing will take place on **March 3, 2022 at 6:30 pm on Zoom.** Gene Schoon (Coordinator of Policy & Justice), Vicki Schroeder (Lead Advisor for Gun Safety), and Bobbie Gaunt (Lead Advisor for Inclusion and Participation) will present on current policy priorities.

The third session in our Theologies of Transformation: Actions for Justice program will be held on Monday, March 28 at 6 pm. We will be discussing our first faith principle on "tenderness". More details to come in upcoming bulletins.
